#### **ROLL CALL**

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by James Martin, Acting Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Transportation System Planning and Programming for the Milwaukee Urbanized Area. He welcomed all present and noted that the meeting was a meeting of the Advisory Committee on Transportation System Planning and Programming for the Milwaukee Urbanized Area (Milwaukee TIP Committee).

Chairman Martin indicated that a sign-in sheet was being circulated for the purposes of taking roll and recording the names of all persons in attendance at the meeting and declared a quorum of the Committee present.

#### APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

Chairman James Martin indicated that the Milwaukee TIP Committee is being asked to consider approval of the minutes from its previous meetings on February 20, and May 23, 2014. He said one action could be taken for approval of both of the meeting minutes. He asked if the Committee members had any changes, and upon hearing none, called for a motion. Mr. Polenske made a motion to approve the minutes for the meetings of the Milwaukee TIP Committee held on February 20, and May 23, 2014. The motion was seconded by Mr. Evans and was passed unanimously by the Committee.

## CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED REALLOCATION OF YEARS 2015-2018 FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM – MILWAUKEE URBANIZED AREA (STP-M) FUNDING

At the request of Acting Chairman James Martin, Mr. Hoel reviewed the memorandum titled, "Proposed Reallocation of Federal Surface Transportation Program – Milwaukee Urbanized Area (STP-M) Funding" (provided as Attachment A to these minutes). Mr. Hoel stated that at the October 4, 2013, Milwaukee TIP Committee meeting, the Committee approved a list of candidate projects recommended for years 2015-2018 Federal Highway Administration Surface Transportation Program - Milwaukee Urbanized Area (STP-M) funding. He noted that these projects were recommended based on the revised procedures that were developed by the Committee to evaluate, prioritize, and recommend projects for STP-M funding. He stated that the City of Milwaukee's project to reconstruct Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue was recommended to receive \$2,521,234 of the requested \$4,785,600 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, and was recommended to be the first project to receive additional STP-M funding for the remaining \$2,264,366 of the requested funding should any project approved for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding be dropped or deferred. He further stated that the Committee had recommended that following the fully funding of the Humboldt Boulevard project, the Village of Germantown's project to resurface Donges Bay Road between Division Road and Magnolia Drive in the Village of Germantown (requesting \$3,289,000 in STP-M funding), the City of Oak Creek's project to reconstruct S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Rvan Road (requesting \$2.781.040) in STP-M funding), and the City of Brookfield's project to reconstruct Calhoun Road between CTH M and STH 190 (requesting \$9,360,000 in STP-M funding) would be prioritized for funding in that order if additional STP-M funding becomes available. Mr. Hoel stated that the project in the Village of Germantown had previously been approved for STP-M funding for preliminary engineering in a previous cycle and that the project in the City of Oak Creek had completed preliminary engineering to State and Federal design standards using local funds. He noted that both of these projects were prioritized for funding as they would have likely received STP-M funding had the procedures to evaluate and recommend projects for funding had not changed for the 2015-2018 funding cycle. He further noted that the project in the City of Brookfield was also prioritized as it was the next highest rated capacity expansion project that was not recommended for funding by the Committee in October.

Mr. Hoel stated that since the October 4, 2013, meeting of the Milwaukee TIP Committee, the following has occurred:

Milwaukee County indicated that they will relinquish the \$2,780,000 recommended by the
Committee for their project to reconstruct Layton Avenue between S. Howell Avenue and S.
Pennsylvania Avenue, since this project was approved to receive Federal Surface Transportation
Program funds made available by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) for
projects that improve freight connections.

- The City of Greenfield has requested that their project to recondition W. Edgerton Avenue between W. Loomis and S. 27<sup>th</sup> Street (requesting \$3,456,668 in STP-M funding) be added to the list of potential projects to receive years 2015-2018 STP-M funds should any projects be deferred or delayed, based on this project having received STP-M funding in a previous funding cycle for preliminary engineering and may be required to return that funding if the project does not proceed, similar to the City of Germantown's Donges Bay Road project.
- The City of Milwaukee has indicated their willingness to make available the \$2,521,234 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding that was recommended to partially fund their project to reconstruct Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue, and as well defer receiving the additional \$2,264,366 requested STP-M funding that would be available for the project because of Milwaukee County relinquishing the years 2015-2018 STP-M funding recommended for their Layton Avenue project.
- The City of Milwaukee has indicated their willingness to exchange their project to reconstruct Howard Avenue between S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street and S. Clement Avenue (requesting \$4,784,000 in STP-M funding) for their project to reconstruct 92<sup>nd</sup> Street between W. Capitol Drive and W. Hampton Avenue (requesting \$3,588,000 in STP-M funding), which had received STP-M funding from a previous cycle for preliminary engineering, similar to the Village of Germantown's Donges Bay Road and the City of Greenfield's W. Edgerton Avenue project. This exchange would make available an additional \$1,196,000 in STP-M funding to allocate to other projects.
- The Village of Germantown has indicated that they will no longer pursue STP-M funds for their Donges Bay Road project because they are now constructing a lesser project that would not meet State and Federal design standards.

Mr. Hoel stated that 1) the relinquishing by Milwaukee County of the STP-M funding for their Layton Avenue project; 2) the City of Milwaukee indicating their willingness to make available the partial funding approved for their Humboldt Avenue project and deferring receiving the remaining funds for that project; and 3) the City of Milwaukee indicating their willingness to exchange the Howard Avenue project for the 92<sup>nd</sup> Street project would make a total of \$6,497,234 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding available to allocate to other projects.

Mr. Hoel stated that the Commission staff is requesting that the Committee consider reallocating \$6,237,708 of the available years 2015-2018 STP-M funding to fund the federal portion of the City of Oak Creek's S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue project (receiving \$2,781,040 in STP-M funding) and the City of Greenfield's W. Edgerton Avenue project (receiving \$3,456,668 in STP-M funding). Mr. Hoel stated that the WisDOT has suggested that the remaining \$259,526 in available 2015-2018 funds be allocated to the City of Milwaukee's  $92^{nd}$  Street project.

Mr. Hoel stated that the Committee is also being asked to consider giving the City of Milwaukee's Humboldt Boulevard project (requesting \$4,785,600 in STP-M funding) first priority and the City of Brookfield's Calhoun Road project (requesting \$9,360,000 in STP-M funding) second priority should additional years 2015-2018 STP-M funding becomes available beyond the \$82.24 million anticipated in the years 2015 through 2018, and/or should other projects approved for 2015-2018 funding be deferred or delayed. Mr. Hoel stated that the Committee is as well being asked to consider giving the City of Milwaukee's Humboldt Boulevard project first priority (that is, guaranteed) for receiving STP-M funds in the next STP-M funding cycle should additional years 2015-2018 STP-M funding not become available for this project. Mr. Yunker added that guaranteeing the funding for this project in the next cycle is being

proposed because of the City of Milwaukee voluntarily deferring STP-M funding for their Humboldt Boulevard project to permit projects in other communities to proceed. Mr. Hoel stated that WisDOT, Milwaukee County, and the Cities of Greenfield, Oak Creek, and Milwaukee, and the Village of Germantown have all reviewed and concur with the proposed reallocation of years 2015-2018 STP-M funding.

Mr. Yunker stated that the proposed reallocation of available STP-M funding to the proposed projects would address concerns of some Committee members at the time of making the recommendations of projects for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding with respect to projects that were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding which had previously received STP-M funding for preliminary engineering, and/or would have received funding under past funding cycle project selection procedures. He added that such projects were a result of the procedures to evaluate, prioritize, and recommend projects for STP-M funding being revised by the Committee, and that there would not be such concerns in future STP-M funding cycles.

The following questions and comments were made by Committee members during and following Mr. Hoel's review:

- 1. In response to an inquiry by Mr. Evans, Mr. McComb stated that Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) staff would not be opposed to the proposed reallocation of STP-M funding as presented by the Commission staff.
- 2. Mr. Daniels questioned why the City of Oak Creek's S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue project and the City of Greenfield's W. Edgerton Avenue project were being proposed for funding when both received relatively low evaluation scores based on the evaluation procedures developed for candidate STP-M projects by the Milwaukee TIP Committee. Mr. Yunker responded that these two projects were proposed to receive years 2015-2018 STP-M funding to address concerns of some Committee members at the time of making the recommendations of projects for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding with respect to projects that were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding which had previously received STP-M funding for preliminary engineering, and/or would have received funding under past funding cycle project selection procedures.

Mr. Grisa made a motion to approve the following changes to the listing of projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding approved by the Milwaukee TIP Committee at its October 4, 2013, meeting:

- Removing the Milwaukee County's project to reconstruct Layton Avenue between S. Howell Avenue and S. Pennsylvania Avenue from the list of projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding as it will instead be funded with STP funds available from WisDOT to improve freight connections, making available \$2,780,000 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding;
- Removing the City of Milwaukee's partially funded project to reconstruct Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue from the list of projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, making available \$2,521,234 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding;
- Removing the City of Milwaukee's project to reconstruct Howard Avenue between S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street and Clement Avenue (\$4,784,000 in 2015-2018 STP-M funding) from the list of recommended projects for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding and adding to the list their project to reconstruct

92<sup>nd</sup> Street between W. Capitol Drive and W. Hampton Avenue (\$3,588,000 in 2015-2018 STP-M funding), making available \$1,196,000 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding; and

• Adding the City of Oak Creek's project to reconstruct S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Ryan Road (receiving \$2,781,040 in 2015-2018 STP-M funds) and the City of Greenfield's project to reconstruct W. Edgerton Avenue between W. Loomis Road and S. 27<sup>th</sup> Street (receiving \$3,456,668 in 2015-2018 STP-M funding) to the list of recommended projects for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, including reallocating the remaining \$259,526 in available years 2015-2018 STP-M funds to the City of Milwaukee's 92<sup>nd</sup> Street project;

Mr. Grisa included in his motion the following changes to the projects identified to receive priority by the Milwaukee TIP Committee at their October 4, 2013, meeting should additional STP-M funding became available:

- No longer prioritize Village of Germantown's project to recondition Donges Bay Road between Division Road and Magnolia Drive for additional funding, as the Village has determined to build a lesser project on this segment of roadway that does not meet State and Federal design standards; and
- Give the City of Milwaukee's Humboldt Boulevard project (requesting \$4,785,600 in STP-M funding) first priority and the City of Brookfield's project to reconstruct Calhoun Road between CTH M and STH 190 (requesting \$9,360,000 in STP-M funding) second priority for receiving additional STP-M funding should more funding become available.

In addition, Mr. Grisa included in his motion that, should additional years 2015-2018 STP-M funding not become available for the City of Milwaukee's Humboldt Boulevard project, then this project would be first priority (guaranteed) for receiving STP-M funds in the next project funding cycle.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Evans, and was carried unanimously by the Milwaukee TIP Committee.

#### REVIEW AND CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE 2013-2016 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN

Mr. Yunker reviewed the memorandum titled "Proposed Amendments to the 2013-2016 Transportation Improvement Program for Southeastern Wisconsin" (provided as Attachment C to these minutes). He stated that the proposed TIP amendments consisted of 11 projects being added to the 2013-2016 TIP, and revisions to 7 projects currently listed in the 2013-2016 TIP. He explained that most of the proposed amendments involved projects that were previously approved for year 2015-2018 STP-M funding.

The following comments and questions were made during and following Mr. Yunker's review:

1. Responding to an inquiry by Mr. Evans, Mr. Yunker stated that the proposed amendments do not include the changes in the allocation of years 2015-2018 STP-M funding approved by the Committee as part of the previous agenda item, adding that the Commission staff did not want to assume approval of the proposed changes by the Committee.

2. Responding to an inquiry by Mr. Polenske, Mr. Yunker said that the Committee could approve the proposed TIP amendments as presented in the memorandum, amended to reflect the action taken by the Committee to reallocate years 2015-2018 STP-M funding that had become available for other projects.

Mr. Polenske made a motion to amend the 2013-2016 TIP as presented and with the following changes based on the motion of the previous agenda item:

- Drop the City of Milwaukee's project to reconstruct Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue (TIP Project 155);
- Drop the City of Milwaukee's project to reconstruct Howard Avenue between S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street and Clement Avenue (TIP Project 632); and
- Revise three existing projects in the 2013-2016 TIP—City of Greenfield's project to reconstruct W. Edgerton Avenue between W. Loomis Road and S. 27<sup>th</sup> Street (TIP Project 146), City of Oak Creek's project to reconstruct S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Ryan Road (TIP Project 544), and City of Milwaukee's project to reconstruct 92<sup>nd</sup> Street between W. Capitol Drive and W. Hampton Avenue (TIP Project 172)—to reflect current project cost and timing, and to change the funding source to STP-M.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Michael Martin and was passed unanimously by the Committee.

Mr. Yunker informed the Committee that a Title VI complaint was filed by seven organizations, including the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), against the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission with regards to the procedures developed last year by the Milwaukee TIP Committee to evaluate, prioritize, and recommend projects for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding. He stated that the complaint was reviewed by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). He stated that FTA has indicated to Commission staff that they have found no basis for the complaint, and that they have closed the complaint.

#### ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Milwaukee TIP Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 10:28 a.m. on a motion from Ms. Weddle-Henning, seconded by Mr. Michael Martin, and carried unanimously by the Milwaukee TIP Committee.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED REALLOCATION OF FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION

PROGRAM - MILWAUKEE URBANIZED AREA (STP-M) FUNDING

On October 4, 2013, the Commission's Advisory Committee on Transportation System Planning and Programming for the Milwaukee Urbanized Area (Milwaukee TIP Committee) approved a list of candidate projects recommended for years 2015-2018 Federal Highway Administration Surface Transportation Program - Milwaukee Urbanized Area (STP-M) funding, as shown on Table 1. One of the projects recommended to receive STP-M funding was the reconstruction of Humboldt Boulevard between North Avenue and Keefe Avenue in the City of Milwaukee. This project, however, was limited to receiving only partial funding, and was recommended to be the first project to receive additional funding should any project approved for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding be dropped or deferred. In addition, at this meeting three additional projects were prioritized for potential funding should projects selected for funding become deferred or delayed. One of these projects was the resurfacing of Donges Bay Road between Division Road and Magnolia Drive in the Village of Germantown, a resurfacing project that had received STP-M funding in a previous funding cycle for preliminary engineering. Another project was the reconstruction of S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Ryan Road in the City of Oak Creek, a reconstruction project which had completed preliminary engineering to State and Federal design standards. Both of these projects would have been selected for 2015-2018 STP-M funding, if the procedures for selecting projects for funding had not changed for the 2015-2018 funding cycle. A third project identified for potential funding was the highest rated capacity expansion project which did not receive funding, the reconstruction of Calhoun Road between CTH M and STH 190 in the City of Brookfield. These four potential projects in recommended priority order for additional funding were as follows:

- 1. City of Milwaukee's reconstruction of Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue (\$2,264,366 in additional STP-M funding)
- 2. Village of Germantown's proposed reconditioning of Donges Bay Road between Division Road and Magnolia Drive (\$3,289,000 in STP-M funding).

- 3. City of Oak Creek's proposed reconstruction of S. 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Ryan Road (\$2,781,040 in STP-M funding).
- 4. City of Brookfield's proposed reconstruction with additional traffic lanes of Calhoun Road between CTH M and STH 190 (\$9,360,000 in STP-M funding).

In making these recommendations for 2015-2018 STP-M project funding, concerns were expressed by the Advisory Committee that projects were not selected for 2015-2018 STP-M funding which had previously received STP-M funding for preliminary engineering, and/or would have received funding under past funding cycle project selection procedures.

Subsequent to the October meeting of the Milwaukee TIP Committee the following has occurred:

- Milwaukee County has indicated their willingness to relinquish the \$2,780,000 in 2015-2018 STP-M funding awarded to their project to reconstruct Layton Avenue (CTH Y) between S. Howell Avenue and S. Pennsylvania Avenue, as the County will receive Federal Surface Transportation Program Freight funds for the project.
- The City of Greenfield has requested that the reconditioning of W. Edgerton Avenue between W. Loomis Road and S. 27<sup>th</sup> Street be added to the list of potential projects to receive years 2015 to 2018 STP-M funding should projects selected for funding be deferred or delayed, as like the Village of Germantown Donges Bay Road project preliminary engineering for this project was funded with STP-M funding awarded in a previous cycle (\$3,456,668 STP-M reconstruction funding requested). Like the Village of Germantown project, the City of Greenfield will need to return to FHWA the preliminary engineering STP-M project funding, if the project does not proceed.
- The City of Milwaukee has indicated their willingness to make available the \$2,521,234 of STP-M funding which had been allocated as partial funding to the reconstruction of Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue, and to defer receiving an additional \$2,264,366 in STP-M funding.
- The City of Milwaukee has also offered to exchange their 2015-2018 funded Howard Avenue reconstruction project between S. 6th Street and S. Clement Avenue (STP-M funding of \$4,784,00) for the 2015-2018 funding of their 92nd Street reconstruction project between W. Capitol Drive and W. Hampton Avenue (STP-M funding of \$3,588,000). This exchange is proposed because the 92nd Street project is in a similar situation as the Germantown and Greenfield projects, having received STP-M funding for engineering in a previous STP-M funding cycle. Also, the exchange of the 92nd Street project with the Howard Avenue project makes additional funding available for other projects.
- The Village of Germantown has determined to build a lesser project on Donges Bay Road which does not meet State and Federal standards, and has dropped their request for STP-M funds.

Therefore, the following is proposed for approval by the Milwaukee TIP Committee to fund construction for those projects with preliminary engineering either underway utilizing STP-M funding from a previous cycle, or completed to State and Federal design standards:

#### 2015-2018 Funding to be Reallocated

- 1. Milwaukee County's reconstruction of Layton Avenue between S. Howell Avenue and S. Pennsylvania Avenue will be funded with Surface Transportation Program Freight funding, making available \$2,780,000 in STP-M funding which had been recommended for this project.
- 2. City of Milwaukee to make available \$2,521,234 of STP-M funding which had been allocated as partial funding to the reconstruction of Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue, and to defer receiving an additional \$2,264,366 in STP-M funding.
- 3. The City of Milwaukee will exchange their funded Howard Avenue project between S. 6th Street and Clement Avenue (\$4,784,000 STP-M funding) for their 92nd Street project between W. Capitol Drive and W. Hampton Avenue (\$3,588,000 STP-M funding). This will make available an additional \$1,196,000 in STP-M funding.
- 4. In total, the STP-M funding to be reallocated totals \$6,497,234.

#### 2015-2018 Funding to be Allocated to Projects

The following projects will receive STP-M funding made available as noted above (The STP-M funding of their projects would represent 80 percent of the total project cost.):

- City of Oak Creek's reconstruction of S. 5th Avenue between STH 100/STH 32 and E. Ryan Road: \$2,781,040 STP-M funding. (Preliminary engineering had been completed to Federal and State standards, and project would have been selected for funding under project evaluation and selection procedures applied in previous funding cycles.)
- City of Greenfield's reconstruction of W. Edgerton Avenue between W. Loomis Road and S. 27th Street: \$3,456,668 STP-M funding. (Preliminary engineering had been funded with STP-M funding in a previous funding cycle, but not selected for 2015-2018 STP-M construction funding.)

The 2015-2018 STP-M funding assigned to these projects totals \$6,237,708.

#### **Priorities for Additional STP-M Funding**

The following would be the priority for receiving additional funding should more funding be made available than the \$82.24 million in STP-M funding anticipated in 2015-2018, and/or should projects selected for 2015-2018 STP-M funding be deferred or delayed.

- 1. City of Milwaukee's reconstruction of Humboldt Boulevard between E. North Avenue and E. Keefe Avenue: \$4,785,600 STP-M funding. (\$2.52 million of recommended funding in 2015-2018 was relinquished to other projects, and project was to be first priority in receiving any additional 2015-2018 funding.)
- 2. City of Brookfield's proposed reconstruction with additional traffic lanes of Calhoun Road between CTH M and STH 190 (\$9,360,000).

#### **Priorities for Next STP-M Funding Cycle**

If additional 2015-2018 STP-M funding does not become available for the City of Milwaukee's Humboldt Boulevard project as a result of dropped or deferred projects, then this project would be first priority (that is, guaranteed funding) for receiving STP-M funds in the next project funding cycle. The next anticipated STP-M project solicitation and selection would occur in 2015. The funding of the project would be guaranteed, as the City of Milwaukee voluntarily released funding to permit projects in other communities to proceed.

#### Review of Proposed 2015-2018 STP-M Funding Reallocation

All four communities involved (City of Greenfield, City of Milwaukee, City of Oak Creek, and Village of Germantown), Milwaukee County, and the State of Wisconsin have reviewed and concur with the proposed reallocation of 2015-2018 STP-M funding.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE 2013-2016 TRANSPORTATION

IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN

Eighteen proposed amendments to the 2013-2016 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Southeastern Wisconsin are provided in Attachment 1 to this memorandum. These proposed amendments are being requested by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and various local municipalities. Seven of the eighteen proposed amendments would revise projects currently in the TIP. The remaining eleven amendments propose the addition of new projects to the TIP.

The proposed amendments may not be expected to affect the implementation schedule of other projects currently programmed in the TIP, and the entire TIP as amended may be expected to remain consistent with projected available funding. All but two of the amendments are exempt from the requirement to conduct an air quality conformity, or regional emissions, analysis with respect to the State of Wisconsin Air Quality Implementation Plan, as the projects entail highway preservation activities. The non-exempt projects are the reconstruction with additional lanes of CTH V (S. 13<sup>th</sup> Street) from W. Drexel Avenue to W. Puetz Road in Milwaukee County (TIP No. 82), and the reconstruction with additional lanes of CTH V (S. 13<sup>th</sup> Street) from W. Rawson Avenue to W. Drexel Avenue in Milwaukee County (TIP No. 628). These projects were included in previous conformity analyses and determinations of the year 2035 regional transportation plan and the year 2013-2016 TIP, and no further conformity analysis or determination is needed.

The amendments address the recently selected projects for 2015-2018 Federal Highway Administration Surface Transportation Program Milwaukee Urbanized Area (STP-M) funding. An evaluation was conducted of the impact of the STP-M project evaluation and selection procedures on minority and low-income populations. This evaluation is provided in Attachment 2 to this memorandum. The Commission's Environmental Justice Task Force at their November 5, 2013, meeting endorsed this evaluation, and the projects recommended for funding.

The Commission will be soliciting public comments on the proposed amendments through August 13, 2014. Any comments received during this period will be forwarded to the Advisory Committee.

The Advisory Committee on Transportation System Planning and Programming for the Milwaukee Urbanized Area will review and consider the proposed amendments at the Meeting of the Advisory Committee on Transportation System Planning and Programming in the Milwaukee Urbanized Area to be held at 10:00 a.m. on August 20, 2014, at the Miller Room at the O'Donnell Park Pavilion.

#### **Attachment 2**

#### ASSESSMENT OF IMPACT OF STP-M PROJECT EVALUATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURES ON MINORITY AND LOW INCOME POPULATIONS

An assessment was conducted of the consequences of the project selection procedures and criteria on minority and low income populations—specifically, whether minority and low income populations receive the benefits of a proportionate share of the projects recommended for funding. The projects recommended and not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding for each type of project by the Milwaukee TIP Committee at its October 4<sup>th</sup> meeting are shown on Map 1, and are listed in Tables 1 through 3. Table 4 lists all of the projects recommended for funding. As shown on Table 5, \$62,515,625, or about 76 percent of the available \$82,244,243 in years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, was allocated to projects within Milwaukee County, the county with the highest proportion of minority and low-income persons within the Milwaukee urbanized area. This proportion of years 2015-2018 STP-M funding allocated to Milwaukee County exceeds the County's proportionate share of 53 percent of the total year 2035 planned county and local arterial lane-miles (the eligible facilities for STP-M funding), 59 percent of the total vehicle-miles travelled (VMT) of the existing county and local arterial streets and highways, and 69 percent of the total year 2010 population within the Milwaukee urbanized area (see Table 6 of Attachment 13). Additionally, about 54 percent, or \$44,767,359, of the total available years 2015-2018 STP-M funding was allocated to City of Milwaukee projects, the city with the largest proportion of minority and low-income persons within the Milwaukee urbanized area. This proportion of years 2015-2018 STP-M funding allocated to City of Milwaukee projects exceeds the City's proportionate share of 27 percent of the total year 2035 planned county and local arterial lanemiles, 32 percent of the total vehicle-miles travelled (VMT) of the existing county and local arterial streets and highways, and 43 percent of the total year 2010 population within the Milwaukee urbanized area. As well, two of the Milwaukee County projects recommended for \$7,020,000 in STP-M funds are located, or predominately located, within the City.

Comparing the candidate projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding utilizing the procedures developed by the Milwaukee TIP Committee to the location of concentrations of total minority persons within the Milwaukee urbanized area (as shown on Map 2), most of the projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding are located within, or within the fringe of, locations of minority populations. Specifically, 10 of the 15 candidate projects located in areas of minority populations were recommended for \$33.39 million, or 40.6 percent of the available years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, 9 of the 19 candidate projects located along the fringe of areas of minority populations were recommended for \$27.01 million, or 32.9 percent of the available funding, and 4 of the 15 candidate projects located outside areas of minority populations were recommended for \$21.84 million, or 26.5 percent of the available funding, as shown on Tables 7 and 8.

Further, comparing the candidate projects not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding to locations of minority populations (as shown on Map 4), there is not a disproportionate share of candidate projects located within areas of minority populations that were not recommended for funding. The highest number of projects that were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding are located either outside or within the fringe of areas of minority populations, with the fewest number of projects not recommended for funding located within areas of minority population. Specifically, 5 of the 15 candidate projects located in areas of minority populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$21.46 million, or 23.7 percent, of the total requested by projects not recommended for funding, 10 of the 19 candidate projects located along the fringe of areas of minority populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$35.06 million, or 38.7 percent, of the total

requested by projects not recommended for funding, and 11 of the 15 candidate projects located outside areas of minority populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$34.09 million, or 37.6 percent, of the total requested by projects not recommended for funding, as shown on Tables 7 and 8.

Further, comparing the candidate projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding utilizing the procedures developed by the Milwaukee TIP Committee to the location of concentrations of low-income persons within the Milwaukee urbanized area (as shown on Map 3), most of the projects recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding are located within, or within the fringe of, areas of low-income populations. Specifically, 13 of the 19 candidate projects located in areas of low-income populations were recommended for \$40.35 million, or 49.1 percent of the available years 2015-2018 STP-M funding, 6 of the 15 candidate projects located along the fringe of areas of low-income populations were recommended for \$20.05 million, or 24.4 percent of the available funding, and 4 of the 15 candidate projects located outside areas of low-income populations were recommended for \$21.84 million, or 26.5 percent of the available funding, as shown on Tables 9 and 10.

Further, comparing the candidate projects not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding to locations of low-income populations (as shown on Map 5), there is not a disproportionate share of candidate projects located within areas of low-income populations that were not recommended for funding. The highest number of projects that were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding are located either outside or within the fringe of areas of low-income populations, with the fewest number of projects not recommended for funding located within areas of low-income population. Specifically, 6 of the 19 candidate projects located in areas of low-income populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$26.74 million, or 29.5 percent, of the total requested by projects not recommended for funding, 9 of the 15 candidate projects located along the fringe of areas of low-income populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$29.78 million, or 32.9 percent, of the total requested by projects not recommended for funding, and 11 of the 15 candidate projects located outside areas of low-income populations were not recommended for years 2015-2018 STP-M funding representing \$34.09 million, or 37.6 percent, of the total requested by projects not recommended for funding, as shown on Tables 9 and 10.







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


