



COMMISSION ELECTS NEW OFFICERS AND WELCOMES NEW COMMISSIONERS

The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission has announced that Commissioner **Michael Crowley** has been elected Chair of the Commission at its December 3, 2025, quarterly meeting. In addition, Commissioner **Natalia Minkel-Dumit** has been elected Vice Chair.

Commissioner Crowley is the CEO of the National Kidney Foundation of Wisconsin. He is also a Waukesha County Board Supervisor for District 16, and Chairman of the Waukesha County Airport Operations Commission. Crowley was appointed to the Commission in 2011 and has served in various officer and committee roles. Currently, Crowley also serves as Chair of the Commission's Executive Committee, Planning & Research Committee, and the Intergovernmental & Public Relations Committee.

Commissioner Minkel-Dumit is an attorney with extensive experience in regulatory law, governance and community engagement. She has previously served as a County Board Supervisor in Ozaukee County, where her involvement included the Natural Resources Committee and Energy Action Committee. Appointed to the Commission in 2021, Minkel-Dumit also serves as Vice Chair of the Executive Committee and is a member of the Planning & Research Committee.

Two new Commissioners have been appointed to the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission by the Governor's office and/or respective County. The new Commissioners were formally seated at the Commission's quarterly meeting on December 3, 2025.

Milwaukee County Commissioner **Isaac Rowlett** is Interim Director of the Milwaukee County Strategy, Budget and Performance Department. He has spent two decades working in the private, public and non-profit sectors leading dozens of strategic planning, organization development, stakeholder engagement, and change management projects. Rowlett was appointed to the Commission by County Executive David Crowley and confirmed by the Milwaukee County Board.

Walworth County Commissioner **Adam Jaramillo** is the Village President of Williams Bay. Jaramillo has served on the Williams Bay Village Board since 2022. He was appointed to the Commission by Governor Tony Evers from a candidate list supplied by Walworth County.

The Commission is currently guided by a total of 21 Commissioners, three from each of the seven member counties: Kenosha, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha. Commissioners are appointed to six-year terms and can serve multiple terms.
