## **About Us**

The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission is the official areawide advisory planning agency for Kenosha, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha Counties and the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Region. While Southeastern Wisconsin makes up about 5% of the State's land area, it contains about 35% of the State's population, jobs, and wealth.

Regional planning is recognized as a necessary function in large metro areas across the Country because development and infrastructure problems often transcend the political boundaries and fiscal capabilities of individual communities. A regional approach is necessary to provide sustainable systems and a sound approach to address topics such as those listed to the right.

The Commission was established in 1960 by State law in response to petitions submitted by each of the seven Southeastern Wisconsin counties. Under *Wisconsin Statutes* 66.0309, the Commission is governed by 21 Commissioners, including three from each county:

- One appointed by the County Board
- Two appointed by the Governor, one from a list prepared by the County

Financial support is generated by a regional tax levy apportioned to each county on the basis of equalized valuation, federal and State funding, and local project contributions.

## **Our Functions**

The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission performs three basic functions to address issues facing the Region's seven counties and 146 cities, villages, and towns:



Provide basic planning and engineering data and analyses to federal agencies, State agencies, and entities throughout the Region. This alone contributes to more cost-effective and informed decision-making in both the public and private sectors.

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Develop a framework of long-range areawide plans for the physical development of the Region, per State requirements. The Commission emphasizes planning that encourages sustainable growth and change, guided by advisory committees comprised of public officials, leaders throughout the Region, and interested residents.




## Coordinate day-to-day planning activities
