
Median household income is **\$17.9K above** the national median household income of \$69.0K.

- As of 2023 the region's population **increased by 5.7%** since 2018, growing by 5,131. Population is expected to **increase by 6.5%** between 2023 and 2028, adding 6,101.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs **declined by 3.1%** in Ozaukee County, WI from 48,177 to **46,685**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 7.0%**. As the number of jobs declined, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 67.9% to 64.2% between 2018 and 2023**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **31.0% of Ozaukee County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (9.8% above the national average), and **8.1% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.7% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Offices of Physicians, and Colleges, Universities, and Professional Schools.



Feb 2024 Labor Force Breakdown




Educational Attainment





Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity






Job Trends






Unemployment Rate Trends




Population Characteristics

Racial diversity is low in Ozaukee County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 38,249 racially diverse people, while there are 9,249 here.




Ozaukee County, WI has 4,324 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 4,864.








Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Growing Occupations



Top Occupation Employment Concentration




Top Occupation Earnings


