RESOLUTION OF THE SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION AMENDING THE ADOPTED REGIONAL WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN, THAT PLAN BEING A PART OF THE MASTER PLAN FOR THE PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE REGION CONSISTING OF THE COUNTIES OF KENOSHA, MILWAUKEE, OZAUKEE, RACINE, WALWORTH, WASHINGTON, AND WAUKESHA IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN (NEW BERLIN SANITARY SEWER SERVICE AREA)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 66.0309(10) of the *Wisconsin Statutes*, the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission, at a meeting held on the 12th day of July 1979, duly adopted a regional water quality management plan as documented in the three-volume SEWRPC Planning Report No. 30, *A Regional Water Quality Management Plan for Southeastern Wisconsin: 2000*; and

WHEREAS, the Commission duly adopted amendments to the regional water quality management plan refining and detailing the New Berlin sanitary sewer service area as documented in SEWRPC Community Assistance Planning Report No. 157, Sanitary Sewer Service Area for the City of New Berlin, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, November 1987, as amended; and

WHEREAS by letter dated August 4, 2009, the City of New Berlin requested that the Commission amend the New Berlin sanitary sewer service area to include certain lands located outside of the currently adopted sewer service area; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment to the regional water quality management plan is documented in a Commission staff memorandum entitled, "Response to Request by the City of New Berlin to Amend the New Berlin Sanitary Sewer Service Area," attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the requested change to the regional water quality management plan, as documented in the aforementioned staff memorandum, was the subject of a public hearing held jointly by the City of New Berlin and the Regional Planning Commission on October 5, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Section 66.0309(9) of the *Wisconsin Statutes* authorizes and empowers the Regional Planning Commission, as the work of making the whole master plan progresses, to amend, extend, or add to the master plan or carry any part or subject thereof into greater detail;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED:

<u>FIRST</u>: That the regional water quality management plan for the Southeastern Wisconsin Region, being a part of the master plan for the physical development of the Region and comprised of SEWRPC Planning Report No. 30, Volumes One, Two, and Three, which was adopted by the Commission as a part of the master plan on the 12th day of July 1979, and which was subsequently amended to include the refined New Berlin sanitary sewer service area, be and the same hereby is amended in the manner identified on Map 1 of the aforementioned SEWRPC staff memorandum.

<u>SECOND</u>: That the Executive Director is authorized to submit findings to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Wisconsin Department of Commerce that public and private sanitary sewer extensions necessary to serve the anticipated development on the lands concerned are in conformance with, and would serve to implement, the adopted regional water quality management plan as herein amended.

THIRD: That a true, correct, and exact copy of this resolution, together with the aforementioned SEWRPC staff memorandum, shall be forthwith distributed to each of the local legislative bodies of the local governmental units within the Region entitled thereto and to such other bodies, agencies, or individuals as the law may require or as the Commission, its Executive Committee, or its Executive Director, at their discretion, shall determine and direct.

SEWRPC STAFF MEMORANDUM

RESPONSE TO REQUEST BY THE CITY OF NEW BERLIN TO AMEND THE NEW BERLIN SANITARY SEWER SERVICE AREA

INTRODUCTION

By letter dated August 4, 2009, the City of New Berlin requested that the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission amend the City of New Berlin sanitary sewer service area tributary to the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) as that area is currently documented in SEWRPC Community Assistance Planning Report No. 157, Sanitary Sewer Service Area for the City of New Berlin, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, dated November 1987, as amended. The basic purpose of the amendment would be to include within the planned sewer service area certain lands located outside the currently adopted sewer service area.

AREA DESCRIPTION

The area to be added to the sewer service area is the New Berlin West High School campus, located at 18695 W. Cleveland Avenue (see Map 1). The high school currently relies upon an onsite sewage disposal system. Inclusion of the site in the sewer service area will allow for the site to be connected to the New Berlin-MMSD sewerage system. The proposed addition to the sewer service area includes the Cleveland Avenue right-of-way between the high school and the currently adopted sewer service area, the expected alignment of the connecting sewer. This satisfies an MMSD requirement that sanitary sewer service area additions be contiguous with the currently adopted sewer service area. This requirement is unique to MMSD. Other properties located along the Cleveland Avenue right-of-way between the high school and the currently adopted sewer service area would not be able to be connected to the sewerage system without first amending the sewer service area plan. The proposed addition to the sewer service area, including the high school campus and road right-of-way, encompasses about 56 acres. The New Berlin High School campus is essentially fully developed with school facilities. The high school campus contains small remnant wetlands encompassing about two acres.

A more detailed delineation of the amended sewer service area and of the environmentally significant lands within is shown on the aerial photograph reproduced as Map 2. The environmentally significant lands shown on Map 2 have been revised to reflect the most recent available natural resource base information.

RELATIONSHIP OF THE PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE EXISTING SANITARY SEWER SERVICE AREA

The proposed addition of about 56 acres to the New Berlin sanitary sewer service area represents an increase in the planned sewer service area of less than 1 percent.

WATER QUALITY IMPACTS


The proposed amendment would enable the provision of public centralized sanitary sewer service to the New Berlin High School, which currently relies upon an onsite sewage disposal system. This may be expected to eliminate the pollutant loadings from the existing onsite system to groundwater.

SEWERAGE SYSTEM CAPACITY IMPACTS

The subject area is included in the MMSD planning area as defined in the MMSD 2020 facilities plan completed in June 2007. The wastewater flows from the subject area were taken into account in the wastewater flow allocations for the City of New Berlin under that facilities plan.

PUBLIC REACTION TO THE PLAN AMENDMENT

A public hearing was held on October 5, 2009, at the New Berlin City Hall to receive public comment on, and reaction to, the proposed sewer service area amendment. The hearing was sponsored by the City of New Berlin and the Regional Planning Commission. A summary of the plan amendment was presented prior to receiving public comment, including a description of the lands proposed to be added to the sewer service area and any environmentally significant lands located within.

No objections to the proposed amendment were expressed at the hearing. Accordingly, no changes were made to the proposed plan amendment as presented at the public hearing.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FOR THE PLAN AMENDMENT

The Common Council of the City of New Berlin adopted the plan amendment on October 13, 2009.

CONCLUDING RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the foregoing, it is recommended that the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission formally amend the City of New Berlin sanitary sewer service area as documented in SEWRPC Community Assistance Planning Report No. 157, in the manner shown on Map 1.
