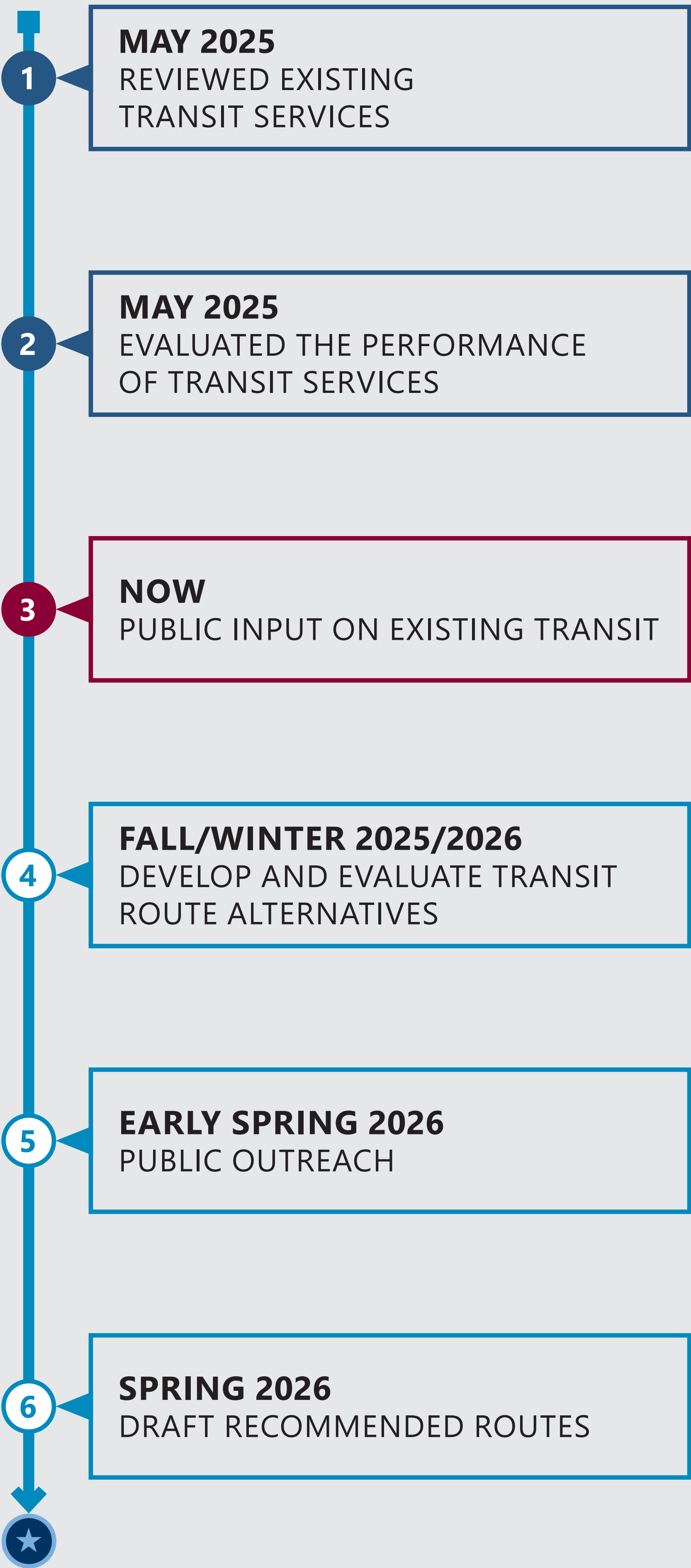

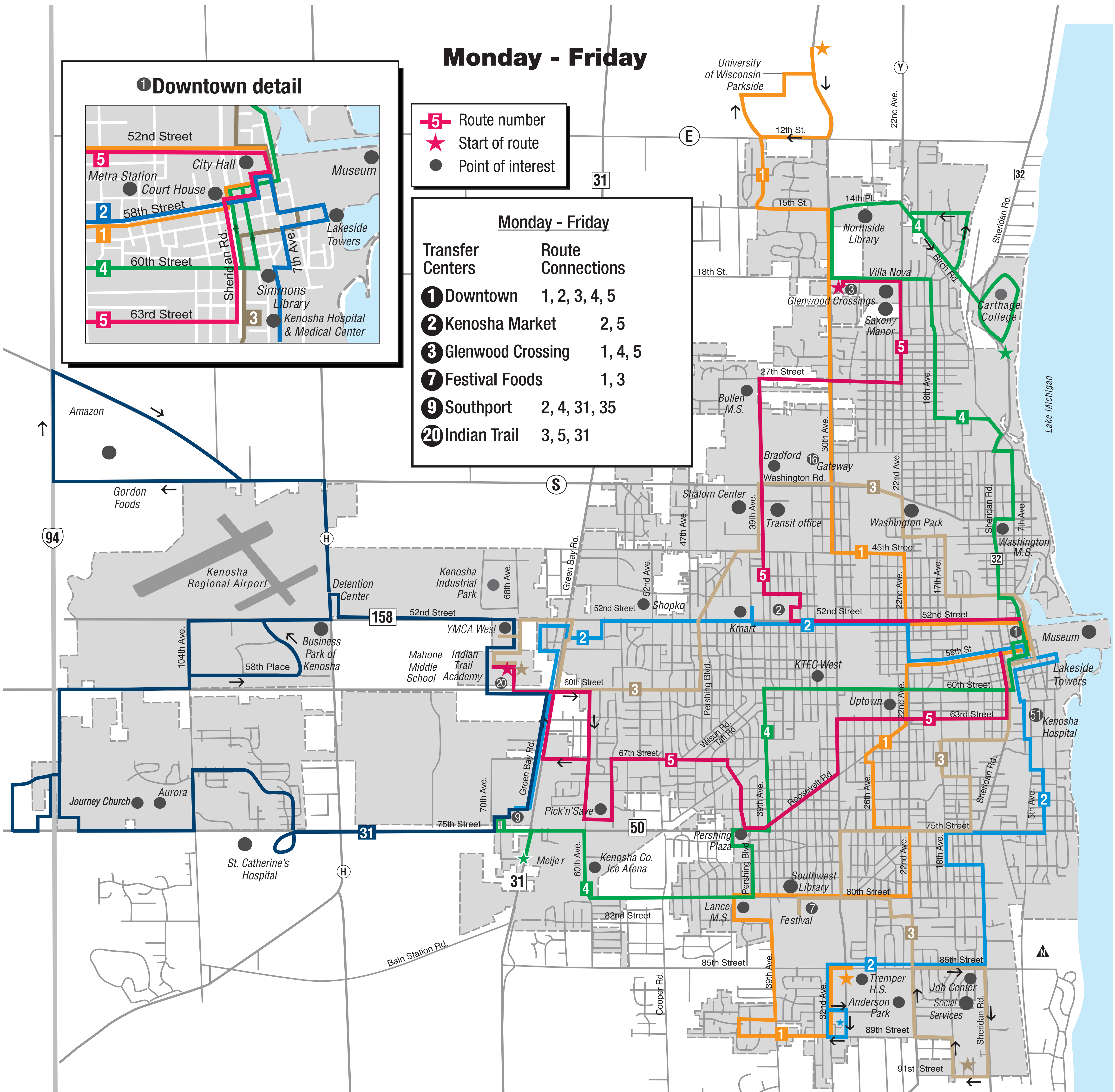

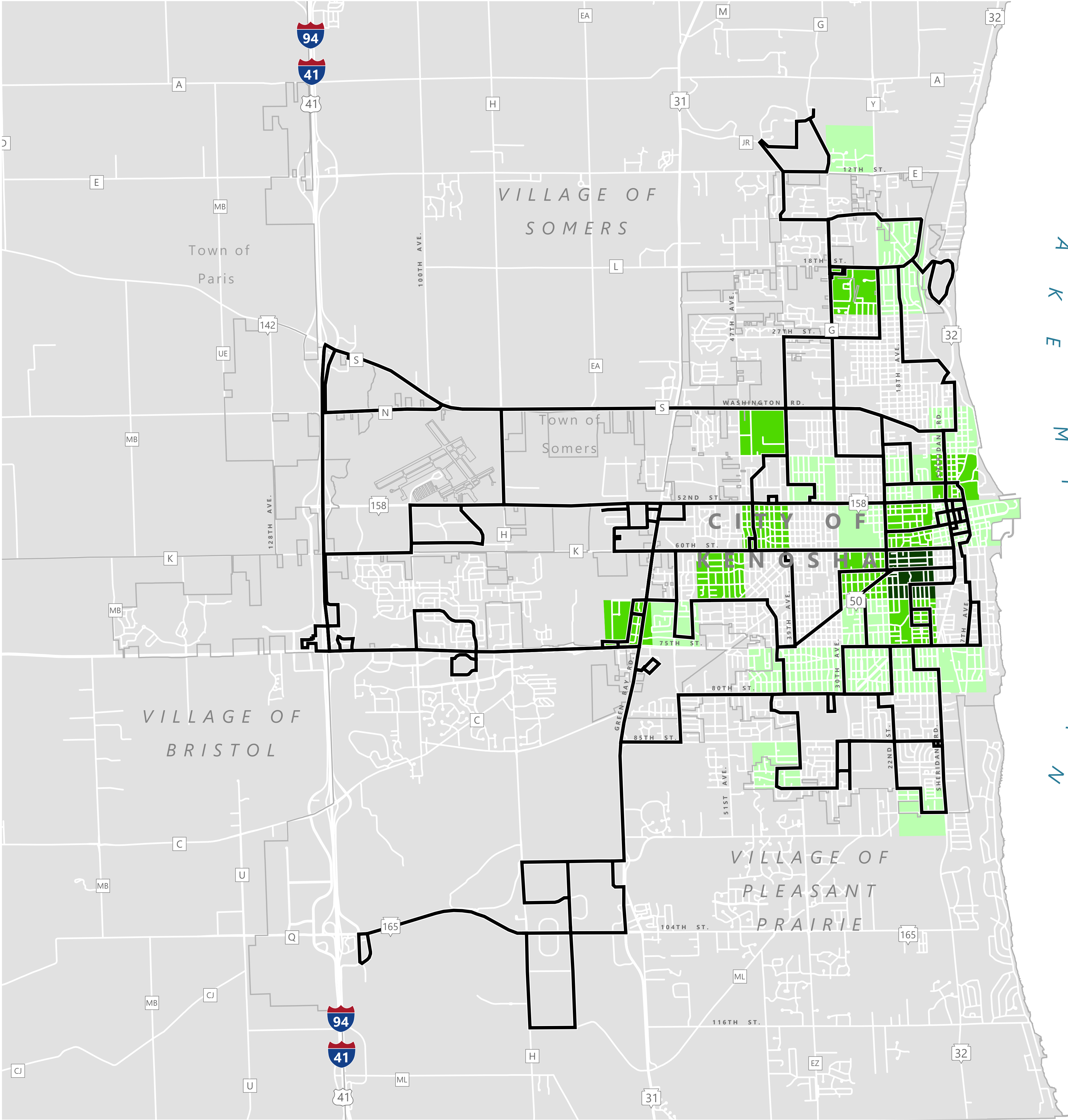
for the Kenosha Area Transit Bus Route Update





WHERE KENOSHA BUS TRIPS ARE STARTING

QUARTER SECTION**

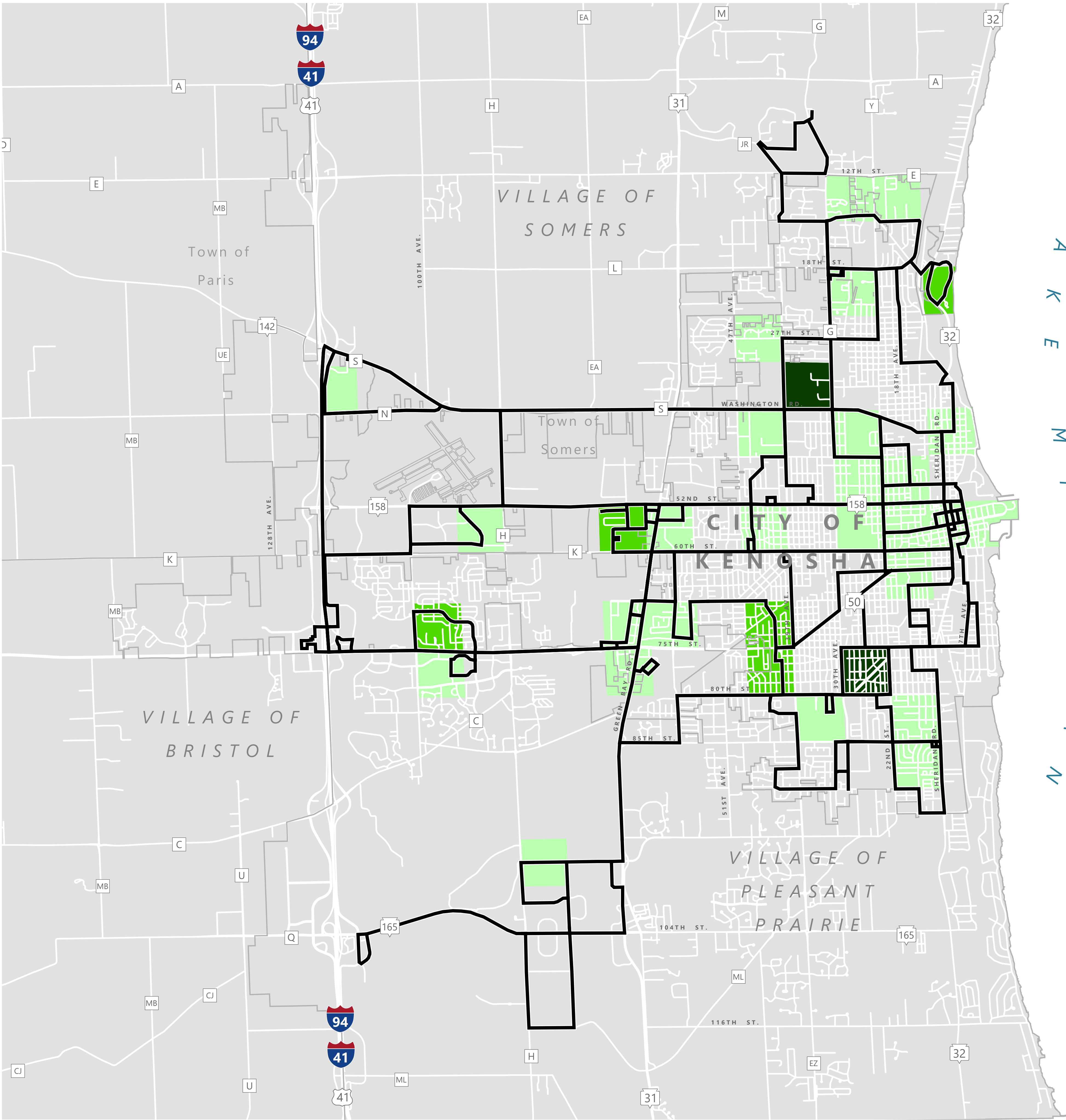

BUS TRIPS ENDED BY QUARTER SECTION

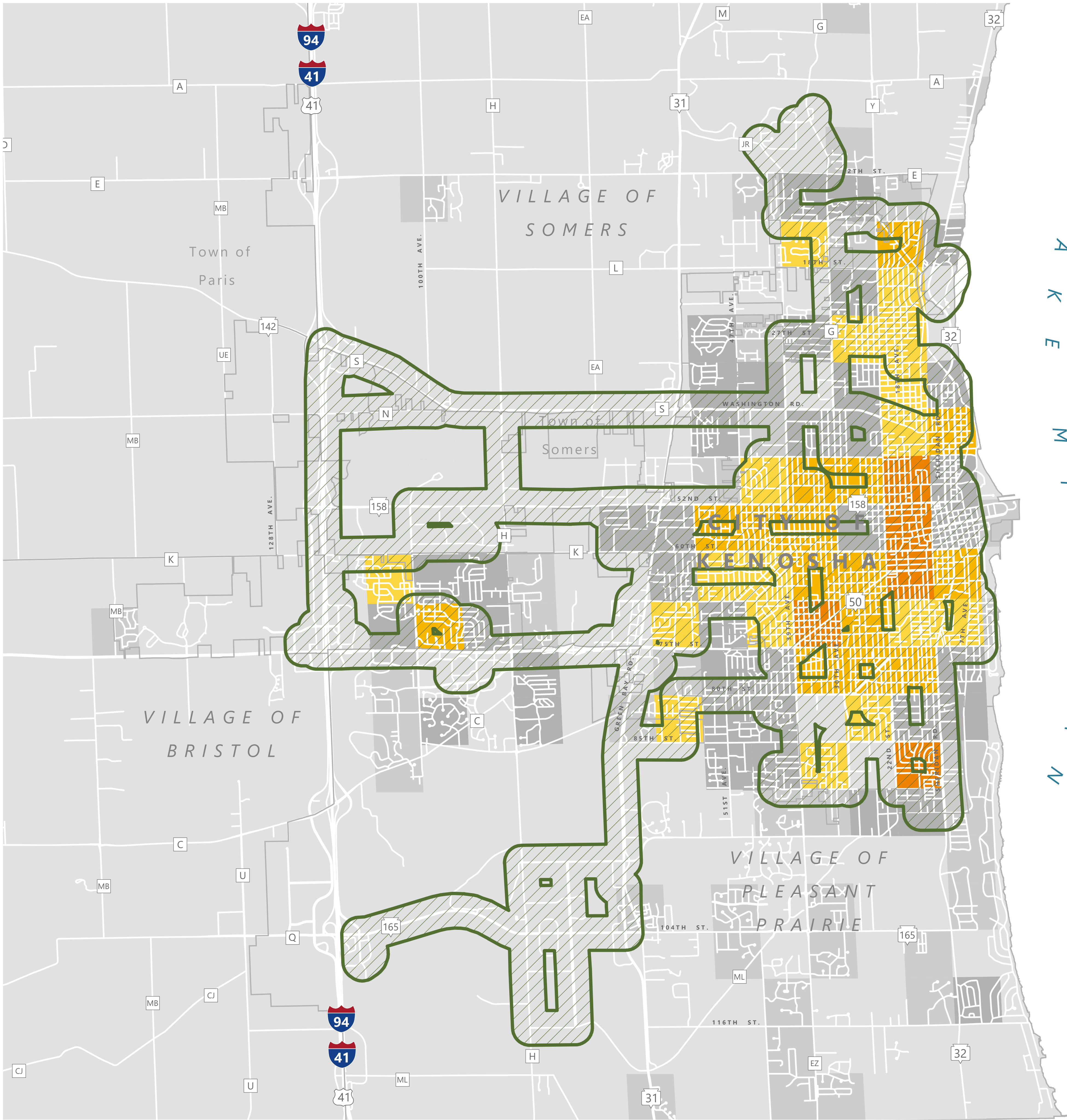

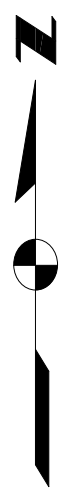
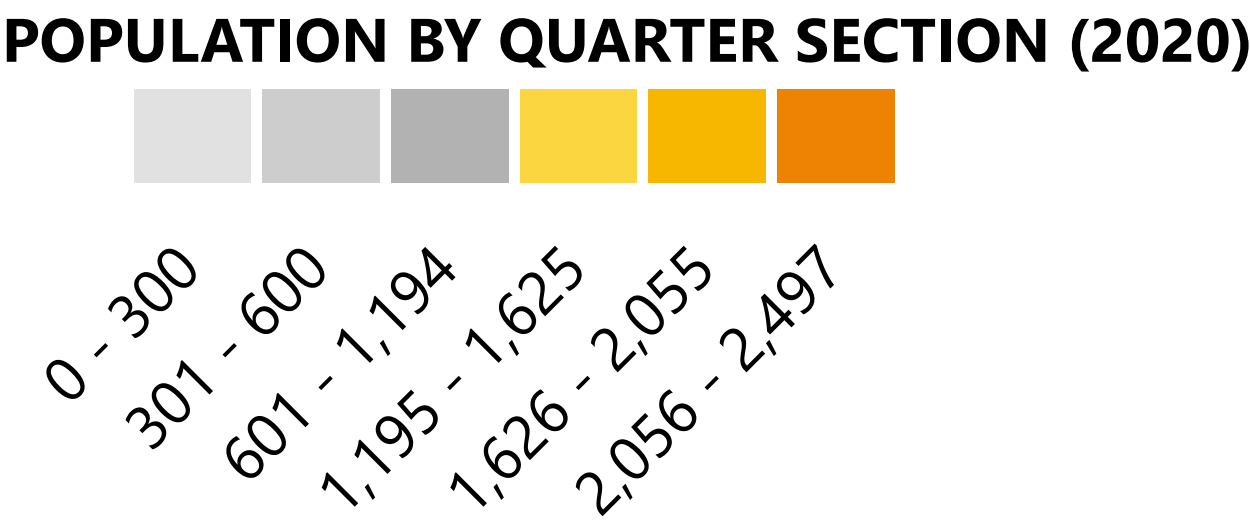
